

Student/Resident Expectations

As Centura Health moves toward returning to normalcy, our facilities may allow students/residents to return to clinical rotations beginning June 1, 2020. Each entity will decide when to allow students/residents to return based on local operations and ability to support student training and Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Check In

All students/residents must enter Centura facilities through the designated entrance location. To be admitted to any of our facilities, students must meet the following requirements:

- No close personal contact with someone with a positive COVID-19 test result within the last 14 days.
- Follow screening requirements at hospital entrance:
 - No temperature $\geq 100.0F$
 - No COVID-19 symptoms, including cough, shortness of breath, sore throat, muscle aches and chills
 - Accept and display screening sticker provided at screening station
 - Leave the facility if not able to pass screening and notify proctor/instructor

This policy will remain the same after hours and on weekends with screening through the emergency department entrance.

Student PPE

Students must provide their own non-medical mask to cover their nose and mouth while at work and serving the public, per the Governor's orders. If a student is at a Centura facility for surgical/procedural/respiratory therapy/EMT training, Centura will provide the appropriate PPE. Students in procedural areas must wear their street clothes into the facility and change into Centura-provided scrubs. Students must return the Centura-provided scrubs at the end of each visit. Training on appropriate use is required by the learning institution prior to arrival. All PPE use should be documented by the student and provided to the proctor/instructor for potential reimbursement by the learning institution.

Students Allowed in Procedural Areas

- Students should not be in care environments where airborne PPE is required. Centura will not be fit testing students for N95s. Exception: Respiratory and EMT students are allowed at the discretion of the local leadership that has fit testers and adequate PPE.
- Students entering a procedural area must have approval from on-site OR/IR/Cath-lab/etc. leadership.
- Students are not allowed in procedural rooms during intubation and extubation, with the exception of respiratory and EMT students.
